Themes	Contents
Generation	 Prime Minister Phạm Minh Chính <u>asked</u> the State utility corporation Việt Nam Electricity (EVN) to "firmly ensure" no electricity shortage for production, business and consumption in any circumstance. According to the updated <u>forecasts</u> of the meteorological agency, in the first months of 2024, the North of Vietnam will have more rain, enabling hydropower plants to maintain their operations. Meanwhile, the South will face a drought risk due to less unseasonal rain. Limited supplies, a rise in demand, and exorbitant electricity purchase expenses potentially result in electricity <u>shortage</u> in 2024.
Demand	 UNDP officials <u>believed</u> that energy efficiency should be a critical priority for Vietnam. As Vietnam faces an approximately 8.5 per cent annual growth rate in energy demand, improving energy efficiency is a foremost national priority in achieving these targets and realising carbon neutrality by 2050.
Market	• The Ministry of Industry and Trade (MoIT) <u>issued</u> a directive to Vietnam Electricity (EVN) urging the swift establishment of a two-tier electricity pricing mechanism.
Fuel	 2023 is considered a <u>successful</u> year for Vietnam National Coal and Mineral Industries Holding Corporation Limited (Vinacomin), with an estimated turnover of 170 trillion VND, reaching 100.3% of the plan.
Grid	 On January 18, Vietnam Electricity (EVN) began the <u>construction</u> of various 500kV circuit-3 transmission lines in the provinces of Ha Tinh, Nghe An, Thanh Hoa, and Thai Binh. They are part of a 500kV circuit-3 transmission line project which spans 519km from Quang Binh to Hung Yen. The National Assembly <u>agreed</u> to spend over US\$100 million to supply electricity to Con Dao.
Planning/ others	 The Government <u>issued</u> Decree 02/2024/ND-CP on transferring power projects as public assets to the Electricity of Vietnam (EVN). The Decree will take effect from March 1, 2024. Vietnam is preparing to <u>widen</u> a probe into alleged corruption in the energy sector. The probe is likely to involve other officials from the finance and trade ministries and some related companies. Vietnam is <u>among</u> the five Asia-Pacific economies that have exceeded the decarbonisation rate targets outlined by their Nationally Determined Contributions (NDCs), according to PwC's Net Zero Economy Index 2023.
